Tomah Health is a new state-of-the-art \$66 million facility located in Tomah, Wisconsin. The 40-acre site was purchased in 2014 with the hospital completed in 2019. The three-story, 140,000 square foot building could have been daunting real estate for patients and visitors to navigate, if not for the friendly and accessible signage and wayfinding solutions.
